

## PROCEDURE POLICY #7

### ELECTRICAL/ELEVATOR SECTION

#### **ITEM:**

#### **COMBINATION ELECTRICAL INSPECTIONS.**

#### **PROCEDURE:**

The Combination Inspectors perform the electrical rough in and all other electrical inspections on one- and two- family residential remodels, room additions and residential accessory structures **with the exception of electrical services, service changes, panel board changes, feeders, service equipment relocation, and swimming pool finals.** These inspections are made by the Electrical Section Inspectors.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Starting in **January 1992**, the Combination Inspectors began performing all **rough-in and final** electrical inspections for one- and two- family **residential remodels, room additions and accessory structures.**

Starting in January 1992, the Combination Inspectors began performing final electrical field inspections for one- and two- family **residential swimming pools**, (however, see note below).

#### **NOTE:**

Starting in **April 1994**, the electrical section began performing the **final** electrical inspections (including the final building inspections) on one- and two- family **residential swimming pools.**

#### **NOTE:**

Beginning **January 4, 1999**, the Electrical Section of OCI began making electrical **finals** on all **new one- and two-family dwellings.** The electrical contractor must call for the electrical service inspection on all new one- and two- family residences, requesting that the electrical service to the structure be released to the electrical utility company (Westar) for the permanent meter connection. Since the Electrical Section of OCI is making the final electrical inspections on new one- and two- family residences (instead of the Building inspection section) the electrical contractor must call for the **final** electrical inspection.
